

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Hybrid/In-Person Students:

- 1) Is a mask required on the bus and at school?** Yes, all students and staff must wear a mask. Gaiters, bandanas, and neck warmers are unacceptable. Everyone's mouth and nose MUST be COVERED. Masks should be worn from home to school. All students will be required to have a mask on upon entering the building. If you have questions regarding masks and an existing medical condition, please call Deb Grenier or Lynn Coleman in the Nurse's Office.
- 2) When will I know my child's bus time and bus stop?** The Transportation Coordinator is working to finalize all bus routes at this time. This has been a cumbersome process and your patience is appreciated. Please check the website on Tuesday, September 8 after 1 pm. The routes will be posted by that time.
- 3) What can my child bring to school for a backpack, etc.?** Students will be allowed to carry their mesh or clear backpacks during the school day; from class to class or into their career area. Students will also be able to carry laptops/devices in their respective bag/carrier along with charger if necessary.
- 4) Can my child use a cellphone as a device?** Yes, this will be permitted during school this year. Students can access phones when advised by staff members and during lunch period. We are encouraging all students to take a PICTURE of the SCHEDULE to cut down on the number of students needing to access the offices during the morning rush. If students take a picture of the schedule, it can be referenced on the phone rather than seeking an additional paper copy.
- 5) Can my child carry a water bottle and access water throughout the school day?** The students will have access to the water filling stations with disposable cups as needed. If your child has a medical condition, please contact the Nurse's Office.
- 6) Will my child receive grades this year?** Yes, grading will resume; credit and no credit were enforced during the Spring.
- 7) Can my child be dropped off at 7 am?** Yes, students can be dropped off at the gymnasium, no earlier than 7 am. Students will remain in the GYMNASIUM until the first period bell rings at 7:35 am. If your child participates in the breakfast program, please drop your child off at DOOR G by the Hill Top Restaurant.
- 8) Can my child switch buses or ask to ride another bus?** No, we cannot accommodate any changes. One bus, one stop only.
- 9) Can my child bring their device?** Yes, we are encouraging Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) to school as the demand for technology is immense.

10)When will my child have a mask break? Mask breaks will take place during 3rd period and during lunch period.

11)Will my child receive a new school ID? Yes, all students will receive a new ID as soon as possible.

12)Dismissals and Late Arrivals: Usual protocol. Please come through the Main Office and ensure masks are being worn adequately.

13)What can my child bring to lunch? Students are encouraged to bring disposable items for lunch whenever possible. Lunch bags are allowed. Lunch will be served in the Café and the Gym to meet the guidelines.

14)How will the students enter the building and exit the building? There will be staggered entry and exit from the building to limit contact with others.

15)Will students have access to lockers? No, lockers will not be utilized.

16)Will students face consequences for not complying with mask policy, cell phone policy, COVID protocols? Yes, any student not in compliance will face progressive discipline measures.

17)During the remote component of the HYBRID model, will my child have to follow the typical school day? Yes, students will be required to follow the period schedule AND teachers will be taking attendance during each class. Students should be logging in to Zoom/Teams meetings on time to avoid being marked tardy. Teachers, academic and vocational, will be sending out invitations for live meetings. Your child will receive a course syllabus from each teacher explaining the remote learning protocols.

18)Sports, extra-curricular activities, after school supports: At this time, there will be no in-person sports, activities, supports after 2:30 pm. There will be no late bus transportation.

Orientation Days for HYBRID/In-Person students:

On September 10th, the Freshmen and the Juniors will take part in a full day orientation that includes time in both the academic and vocational settings. Student drivers are allowed to drive to campus and the bus routes will run accordingly that day.

On September 11th, the Sophomores and the Seniors will take part in a full day orientation that includes time in both the academic and vocational settings. Student drivers are allowed to drive to campus and the bus routes will run accordingly that day.

Remote Learning Option Students (RLO)

- 1) **Who will be teaching my child?** Full remote students will be receiving ACADEMIC instruction from TECCA and vocational instruction from Bay Path Vocational Teachers.
- 2) **Can my child change from Full Remote to Hybrid?** Yes, at the end of second quarter in January. Please see the RLO Contract for timelines.
- 3) **Can my child do Co-Op during Full Remote?** No, full remote students cannot do Co-op.
- 4) **Does my child have to have a camera on the device for remote learning?** Yes, a camera is required. Phones can be used.
- 5) **Will there be an orientation for Remote Learning Students?** Yes, we are scheduling a Zoom meeting for Thursday, September 10. More information will be forthcoming. Please pay close attention to your email.
