Dear members of the Class of 2018 and parents,

As class advisors to the Class of 2018, Mrs. Croke and I would like to remind you of the responsibilities and events which will be taking place during junior year.

CLASS DUES

Class dues for the year are \$30.00.

If dues have not been paid the prior years, \$10 is owed for freshman year and \$20 is owed for sophomore year.

It is important to pay the class dues yearly so that you are not faced with a large bill during senior year.

FUNDRAISING

There will two, and possibly three, fundraisers this year. The first one will be held October 15 through November 1 and will be the sale of Halladay's Harvest soups, cheesecake mixes and dips. The second fundraiser will be the sale of Yankee Candle products and will be held during the month of April.

It is important for students to participate in the fundraising activities in order to reduce the cost of their events (Junior prom, Senior prom, and class trip). Students receive 25% of the sales of their fundraising in their personal account which can be used to defray the cost of their activities. For example, if a student sells \$100 in products each year (grades 9 – 12), they would have 25% of \$400 in their account. That would be \$100. They may use that to buy 2 prom tickets either year or pay for one prom ticket and their class trip.

JUNIOR PROM

The junior prom will be held on Friday, May 5, 2017 at LaSalle in Southbridge MA. The theme of the prom is "A Knight to Remember". Tickets will be on sale April 3 through April 13. The cost is yet to be determined pending the meal options. We are attempting to keep the ticket price between \$50 and \$60.
