**College bound students** get ready for the application process! This is a fun and exciting time and I am here to help you along the way. If you are applying to a 4-year college you should have taken the SAT's. If you have not the next SAT is October 1<sup>st</sup>. Please go to [www.collegboard.org](http://www.collegboard.org) to register.

We are hosting a **College Fair on Thursday September 22, 2016 from 6:00 – 8:00 p.m.** This is a great opportunity to talk with college admission counselors, and learn about the admission process. We will have up to 50 colleges in attendance. This is a great event for families and students to learn about the opportunities available to them after graduation.

When applying to college please make note of the application deadlines. **If you are applying Early Action most deadlines are November 1, 2016. Regular acceptance deadlines are usually in February.** Please check those deadlines to make sure you have enough time to gather all the required documents necessary to apply.


**Bay Path is now using Naviance to manage the college admissions process.** During junior year, your child had a Naviance workshop in their English class. Each student created their own Naviance account and started their college searches. Most colleges and Universities use the Common Application as part of their application process. *Seniors who are applying to college will have another Naviance workshop in the beginning of the school year to teach them how to use the Common Application through Naviance.* **The Common Application must be matched to your Naviance account in order for colleges to receive your materials.** Please see the enclosed brochure for more information.

Please note, **seniors MUST PASS ALL CLASSES** in order to fulfill graduation requirements. Keeping up with your homework is crucial to ensure a successful senior year. If your child is finding difficulty in their classes, please contact me. *You will receive 4 progress reports and 4 report cards throughout the year to keep track of your child's progress.* You also have access to iParent to retrieve the most up to date grades. **Seniors, this year is a great time to consider co-op!!!** In order to qualify for co-op seniors must have a yearly average grade of a 70 at the end of their junior year and must not have failed fourth quarter. Students are expected to have a grade of 70 or better in each academic class. Take advantage of your vocational education and consider co-op!

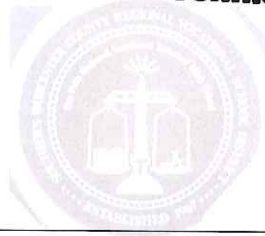

## TO MEMBERS OF THE CLASS OF 2017:

Another school year is fast approaching! You are now entering your Senior year of high school and working towards your graduation!

In addition to your academics, we wish to remind you about a couple events specific to your Senior Year.

**First-** your class dues of \$40 will be collected. **All dues must be paid prior to ordering caps and gowns.** Freshmen dues were \$10, Sophomore dues were \$20, and Junior dues were \$30. The total amount of dues over the four years is \$100 dollars. Remember that dues are collected to cover the graduation ceremony expenses, caps and gowns, and senior awards night.

**Second-** Some important dates: The Senior Prom will be held May 19<sup>th</sup> 2017 at Leicester Country Club. Graduation will be June 2<sup>nd</sup> 2017 There will be a senior class trip. (Date, time and place TBA)

**Third -** We will be conducting a couple fundraisers for the class. We are planning on Krispy Kreme Donuts and Yankee Candles. You are not obligated to participate in the fundraising. However, much of the money you raise yourself will be placed into your account to help defray the future costs of the proms and class trip. It is sometimes easier to participate in the fundraising each year than it is to come up with a substantial sum of money all at once to pay for these events. You may even be eligible for a free ticket to prom due to the large amounts of money you bring in from the fundraising. Please keep that in mind when we provide you with the fundraiser packets.
